What do you say when a child asks...

Q: What does Passover mean?

A: Just before Jesus died, he had a Passover meal with his disciples. Passover is the special celebration Jews hold every year to remember when the Israelites left Egypt and started their trip to the Promised Land. Moses had told Pharaoh that because he wouldn't let the Jews go, all the firstborn boys would die. But God told the Jews to put the blood of a lamb over the door so the angel of death would see the blood and pass over them and spare the Jewish children. Today, Jews still celebrate Passover. Christians celebrate the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) rather than Passover.

Key Verse: "This yearly 'Feast of Unleavened Bread' will help you always remember today. It will remind you of the day when I brought you out of the land of Egypt. It is a law that you must celebrate this day every year, generation after generation." (Exodus 12:17)

Related Verses: *Exodus 12:1-30; Matthew 26:17-19, 26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26*

Related Questions: Why did they want to have the Last Supper in the house of someone they didn't know? Why did the disciples recline at the table to eat?

Note to Parents: The Christian celebration of Communion comes from Jesus' celebration of Passover. Just before Jesus died, had had a Passover meal with his disciples. As they ate bread and wine, he told them that the bread was his body that would be broken for them and the wine was his blood that would be shed for them. Jesus is our Lamb that was killed; because of his blood, we can have eternal life.
