What do you say when a child asks...

**Q:** How did Jesus do miracles?

A: Jesus was able to do miracles because he was God's Son. The miracles weren't magic or tricks; they really happened. Jesus performed miracles because he had compassion on people and because he wanted to show people that he was the Messiah, the promised one from God. Only God can do real miracles. Sometimes God worked his miracles through special people, like the prophets or apostles. We read in the Bible about a lot of miracles, but miracles didn't happen every day. More miracles happened when Jesus was on earth than at any other time, but only during the three years that he was preaching and teaching in public. Jesus didn't do miracles to show off, and he didn't heal everybody. He had a purpose for everything he did.

**Key Verses:** Jesus' disciples saw him do many other miracles besides the ones told about in this book. But these [miracles] are recorded so that you will believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God. And when you believe this truth, you will have life. (John 20:30-31)
